

National Village Museum

Visit of Village Museum on the 14th of October – included in the spouses program

Founded in 1936 by Royal Decree and covering an impressing surface of 15 hectares of the Lake Herăstrău in Bucharest, The Village Museum is one of the greatest outdoor museums in the Balkans.

Among original windmills, farmsteads, watermills and houses from the mid 19th century, the visitor will get acquainted with the Romanian rural architecture and design.

The museum depicts really well the abundance of the peasants' life. It also reveals the diversity of wood architecture, the originality of wood manufacturing and processing, the Romanian peasant's creativity and initiative of minutely embellishing anything and everything.

It is easy to get around the museum as it is divided into several areas, depending on the origins of the constructions. All the patrimony buildings have been dismantled and taken form their original location (a specific rural part of Romania) and have been brought to Bucharest by train, carriage or car.



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
